





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The meeting opened at 7 pm with a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  minute video on Bedford Park, created by a volunteer, Elisabetta Pisa.

**WELCOME:** President Kirsten Cooke welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced the current Board of Directors and key volunteers.

HISTORY & REACTIVIATION: She then provided the background to BPRO reforming from dormancy. Originally formed in 1999, BPRO fell dormant a number of years ago. The current Board was formed from group of volunteers who were involved in fundraising to help object to issues arising from the proposed development at 250 Lawrence.
